Designed for first-year students, the Aquinas Program is an innovative approach to teaching and learning that combines the academic disciplines in a small-class setting, emphasizes team teaching, and includes interdisciplinary approaches to a high level of reflection and critical thinking. While providing excellent academic credit, Aquinas highlights the interdisciplinary nature of the academic disciplines and their application to the real world.

First-year students typically take several courses in the academic subject. In Aquinas, these courses are organized into the sections in a common theme and the same group of students and professors. Enrollment is limited to each discipline's common first-year level.
