Designed for first-year students, the Aquinas Program is an innovative approach to teaching and learning that combines the best of academic disciplines in a small-class setting, peer-to-peer learning, team teaching, and interdisciplinary approaches to achieve a high level of intellectual and critical thinking. While providing excellent academic credit, Aquinas highlights interdisciplinary and then a deeper understanding of the discipline.

First-year students typically take several courses in the academic subject. In Aquinas, these first-year courses are organized in a sequence in which a common theme and the same group of students and professors. Enrollment is limited to each discipline's common first-year level.
