

Notification of Admission

• All applicants who are accepted for admission to a certificate program under the University's Adult Learner policy will receive a notification of admission letter from the Registrar's Office. The notification letter will include the following information:

- The name of the certificate program to which you have been admitted.
- The start date of the certificate program.
- The location of the certificate program.
- The name of the advisor who will be assigned to you.
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Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice

Candidates for admission to the Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice must meet the following requirements:

- Have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) in all college-level coursework.
- Have completed at least 12 credit hours of college-level coursework.
- Have completed at least 6 credit hours of college-level coursework in the field of criminology and criminal justice.
- Have completed at least 3 credit hours of college-level coursework in the field of criminology and criminal justice.
- Have completed at least 3 credit hours of college-level coursework in the field of criminology and criminal justice.

Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice Application Procedures

- All applicants must complete the following steps to apply for admission to the Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice:
1. Complete the application form.
 2. Pay the application fee of \$55 (\$40 for students with a current University ID).
 3. Submit a letter of application describing your educational background, work experience, and academic plans.
 4. Submit a letter of application describing your educational background, work experience, and academic plans.
 5. Submit a letter of application describing your educational background, work experience, and academic plans.

Note: Candidates who are applying for admission to a certificate program under the University's Adult Learner policy should also submit a letter of application describing educational background, work experience, and academic plans. Application Deadlines

Applications for admission to the Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice are accepted on a rolling basis. The application deadline is 31 days before the start date of the certificate program.

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F. Registration

Registration is the process of enrolling in a course. Students must register for each course they wish to take. Registration is required for all students, including those who are taking courses as a part of a certificate program.
