AN H-1013. I **C** **A**

This is an introduction of the field of communication and language and of the methodology of ethnographic fieldwork.

AN H-1023. I **P** **A**

An introduction of the field of human and biological evolution. The focus of this course is on human evolution, human adaptation and genetic, non-human primates, and the role of historical anthropology.

AN H-1033. I **A**

This course is a critical and interdisciplinary approach to the archaeological record, emphasizing cultural change. To illustrate this, the development of complex societies, the rise of the state, and the role of archaeology in human history will be discussed. Basic archaeological methods, theory, and ethnography will be presented. Multiculturalism, from the dawn of the world, will illustrate the archaeological record, development, and analysis.

AN H-2013. A **E** **A**

Ethnographic and ethnological fieldwork of the culture of South America.

Prerequisite: ANTH 1013.

AN H-2033. A **E** **I** **L** **C**

Ethnographic and ethnological fieldwork of Indigenous culture and society in Latin and Central Canada. Prerequisite: None, although ANTH 1013 is desirable.

AN H-2043. A **E** **M** **C** **A**

Ethnographic and ethnological fieldwork of the culture of Mexico and Central America.

Prerequisite: ANTH 1013.

AN H-2063. A **E** **N** **A**

Ethnographic and ethnological fieldwork of the culture of North America.

Prerequisite: ANTH 1013.

AN H-2073. A **E** **C**

Ethnographic and ethnological fieldwork of the culture of Canada. Prerequisite: ANTH 1013.

AN H-2323. A

E : **E**, **A**, **O**

The archaeological record of the origin and evolution of human culture and social behavior. Emphasis is placed on early human culture and society, indigenous men, and the evolution of indigenous men.

AN H-2333. A

This course will introduce students to a cultural evolution in the area of the world. Following a general introduction to a archaeological method and technique and the nature of a archaeological record, this course will proceed to discuss the archaeological culture of the area of life of the Neolithic and complex societies - chiefdom and state - the rise and fall of the form of social and political organization. Political practice and the process of social change will be examined in different locations around the globe. Prerequisite: None.

AN H-2343. A

E : **N**, **C**, **A**

This course will introduce students to a cultural evolution in North and Central America based on a archaeological data. The evolution of the region, complex Neolithic and the rise of chiefdom, and the development of early state will be considered. Political and social change will be examined in different geographical regions. A minimum of more than 14,000 years will be considered in the academic term. Prerequisite: None.

AN H-2353. A

E : **A**

This course will introduce students to a cultural evolution in South America and the Caribbean region. The human colonization of the region and the adaptation of the local communities will be considered. The development of agriculture and the adoption of agriculture - the rise and collapse of complex societies will be examined. Political and social change of both region, the rise and fall of early state will be examined in different geographical regions. A minimum of more than 12,000 years will be considered in the term. Prerequisite: None.

AN H 2363. A

E : **M**

The focus of the course will be on human and multidimensional aspects of health and disease in a biogeographical setting.
